

## Channeling General Marshall During the Impact of Coronavirus

On March 12, joining national efforts to mitigate the spread of the coronavirus, the George C. Marshall International Center (GCMIC) closed George C. Marshall's Dodona Manor to the general public. Dodona Manor will remain closed for tours until it is deemed safe by local and regional authorities to reopen. The gardens and grounds are open to our members for family picnics and quiet diversion during the shutdown, so long as physical distancing is strictly adhered to between visiting family units.

In the face of this pandemic we continue the GCMIC mission, bringing to life the timeless values of selfless service and unwavering integrity to develop visionary leaders worldwide. This is our time as an organization, built of an international community of valued members, to serve and inspire. Our leadership programs have not stopped and we have added new virtual programs.

We have reflected on the worldwide trials that George C. Marshall faced during his lifetime, and we found guidance in his words: "When a thing is done, it is done. Don't look back. Look forward to your next objective." Thus, our focus is forward and our hearts are with all of our international community.

## George C. Marshall: Transforming America's Military for World War II

General George C. Marshall became Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army on September 1, 1939, the day that Germany invaded Poland to start World War II. It would be two years before America entered World War II, and Marshall assumed control of an undersized, undertrained army -one that he knew would be significantly ill-prepared for global war. There were fewer than 175,000 men in the U.S. Army at the end of 1939, making it just the 19th largest in the world. As Marshall stated in his 1956 interview with the official U.S. Army historian, Forrest Pogue, "We were into a mobilization almost immediately on my appointment as chief of staff. The Regular component of the ground army was so small that there was almost no place to assign these men for professional experience.

[I remember someone saying that] all the noncommissioned officers of the Regular Army in this country could find reserve seats in Yankee Stadium."

In the years leading up to World War II, President Franklin D. Roosevelt had prioritized the buildup of America's naval and air forces over the expansion, training, and modernization of the army. Marshall, however, wasted no time in making Roosevelt understand the need to modernize and multiply ground forces. By mid-1940, Marshall was Roosevelt's point person in working with Congress on military matters. He worked with the executive and legislative branches of government to transform America's military into the greatest in the world, and one that was crucial to Allied victory in World War II.

# Veterans Day at

## Dodona Manor

Veterans Day was first officially celebrated as a national holiday on November 11, 1938, when General George C. Marshall was Deputy Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army. It is especially fitting that we host an annual celebration for Veterans Day at the Marshalls' beloved home, Dodona Manor.

On November 11, 2019, the George C. Marshall International Center, in tandem with Loudoun County and the Town of Leesburg, held our 15th Annual Veterans Day commemoration at Dodona Manor. Always free and open to the public, the ceremony opened with the Briar Woods High School band performing its drum cadence and Detachment 1205 of the Marine Corps League presenting the colors for the Pledge of Allegiance and the National Anthem. More than 400 attendees joined, including World War II veteran, Sergeant Bill Vitale U.S. Air Force, (Ret.), who served with General Marshall when Marshall was Secretary of Defense from 1950 to 1951.

The keynote speaker, Admiral T. Joseph Lopez, USN (Ret.), delivered a riveting address that honored veterans of all generations and military branches. Admiral Lopez called Marshall "Perhaps our greatest ever soldier-statesman of modern history," and emphasized the importance of keeping Marshall's spirit alive. After the ceremony, all guests were welcomed for a tour of the first floor of George C. Marshall's Dodona Manor


