
The George C. Marshall International Center brings to life the timeless values of selfless service and unwavering integrity to develop visionary leaders worldwide.

The History

We preserve historic Dodona Manor, the home of George and Katherine Marshall, and ensure the house and gardens remain open for tours and individual visits.

"After Katherine Marshall had gotten the property in tip-top shape, she showed it to her husband, home from an arduous wartime meeting with Prime Minister Winston Churchill. Surveying its sweeping lawns, he said teary-eyed, 'A home, a real home after 41 years of wandering.""— Rachel Thompson, Marshall Historian

- DODONA RESTORATION CONTINUED, with new roof installed, crack in the north wall repaired, and windows and shutters replaced – supported by 5 volunteers.
- VOLUNTEERS PROVIDED SELFLESS SERVICE, including 60 docents and greeters conducting 540 tours and 7 gardeners growing 748 lbs. of vegetables for the local food bank (up 166 lbs. from 2022!).
- VISITORS CONTINUED TO TOUR DODONA, with 2,119 registered visitors experiencing the home and gardens in 2023.
- ANNOUNCED PLAN TO BUILD NEW MUSEUM AND VISITOR
 CENTER to preserve and share the Marshall story with future generations.
- ADVANCED NATIONAL PARK AFFILIATE STATUS for Dodona Manor, with legislative support from Rep. Jennifer Wexton and Senators Mark Warner and Tim Kaine.
